Revised Total Coliform Rule (RTCR) Failure to Report Monitoring Events to the State that are Not Related to *E. coli* – positive Sample Results –

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Reporting Requirement(s) Not Met for City of Wilmer Water System

We are required to report the results of monitoring of your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water meets health standards. During April 1, 2016, we did not report the results of monitoring for contaminants.

Our system failed to notify the state drinking water program as required by April 1, 2016. Although public health was not impacted, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct the situation.

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time. You do not need to boil your water or take other actions.

What is being done?

While we did not notify the state as quickly as we should have, we have provided the missing reports to the state and have revised our procedures to ensure we comply with reporting requirements in the future by September 30, 2017. We are no longer in violation.
